Pocket Phonics

Reading is the gateway for children that makes all other learning possible.

The old saying "practice makes perfect" ties in well with phonics, as it is an important tool for children to develop reading fluency. Over time, children are able to develop into fluent readers who can quickly recognize familiar words and easily sound out new words they encounter. As children develop their reading skills and learn about people, places, and events outside of their own experience, they begin to imagine how they would feel in that situation. They see the world with new eyes and can better visualize the descriptions of what they read.



In phonics students learned in vowel-consonant-e pattern, the first vowel makes the long sound and the letter e at the end is silent.

For example : cape, bone and vine etc...

Really learning and reading is fun. Our young KG2 learners presented their understanding of long vowels through illustrations ,reading and writing the words.



Health & Beyond

Occupation therapy is based on engagement in meaningful activities of daily life, such as self-care skills, education, work or social interaction, especially to enable or encourage participation in such activities despite limitations in physical and mental functioning.



Occupation therapy also incorporates sensory integration techniques to help children who struggle with sensitivity to touch, texture, light and sound; as well as balance and body positioning in space.



They use a variety of play based materials such as yoga balls, animal walks, scooter and balance board, swings, obstacle course and also incorporate with board games and manipulatives helping in holistic development in gross and fine motor skills.



Occupation therapy is built upon a foundation belief that children learn best through engaging in their natural "occupation" of play, the goal is that the 'occupation or work' should be fun.



An OT can address wide range of difficulties experienced by a child with disabilities including

- Attention span and focus
- Sensory and processing skill
- Fine and gross motor development.
- Activities of Daily Living (ADL)
- Visual perceptual skill.

Children's Day

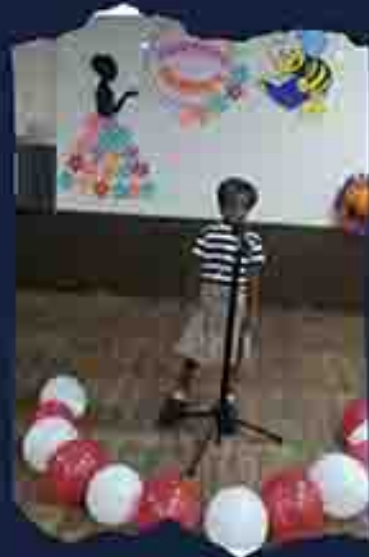
"Every child is a different kind of flower that altogether makes this world a beautiful garden."
